

I first became acquainted with Camp Alkulana in the summer of 1982. I

found myself whiling away the vacation at my parent's new home in Richmond as I waited for my freshman year at Mississippi College. Leaving behind my little mission school in Korea and all the friends of my youth, I felt like a fish out of water. A summer job would have been a nice distraction, but neither my brother Kevin nor I had any success finding one. So there I sat—insecure, bored, and culture-shocked!

Then later in July, an invitation came by way of Dr. Copeland, my parents' new pastor at Derbyshire. He had heard of a pressing need at the rustic little summer camp in Bath County operated by the Richmond Baptist Association. They had lost a couple of counselors in mid -summer and needed some fresh recruits to help out for the last 2-week session. I wasn't thrilled by the prospect, but that's how Kevin and I ended up at Camp Alkulana.

I loved the outdoors and was fairly adept at camp crafts, but I was also a little shy around strangers and a bit intimidated about working with inner-city kids. There were numerous times during those two weeks that I swore I would never get sucked into that again! But then something happened. Alkulana got into my blood. For six out of the next eight summers, I spent at least a few weeks as a camp counselor. Alkulana became my home away from home. The campers gave me a purpose, the counselors became my friends, and Gracie the camp director was a model of so much that is good about Christian ministry. And the place itself—a tiny camp of old weathered buildings and evergreens nestled in a little valley with a babbling brook—it is still dear to my heart.

You may not know this, but if it weren't for Alkulana, I might not be your pastor. I met a young college girl there named Gina George back in '83. She went on to marry a guy named Hazelgrove. I'm pretty sure that's how my name came up to the pastor search committee. The rest is history!

Anyway, Camp Alkulana is celebrating 100 years of ministry, primarily to the inner city children of Richmond. Broadus has been supporting that ministry for many years through our financial gifts and some personal involvement. Alkulana was also recently entered into the Virginia Landmarks Registry by the Department of Historic Resources. What an honor! It is the oldest continually operating camp in Virginia.

I am very thankful for what Alkulana has meant to me and thousands of others. I plan to attend the centennial celebration at FBC Richmond on March 21.
